I am emailing you to inform you that I am objecting to the application for the premises licence of the above property, the reasons for my objection are listed below.

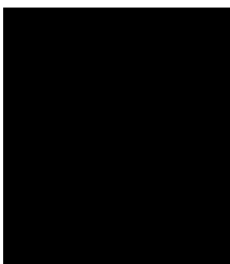

2. The area of the building fall within the william knibb ward and crime levels are one of the highest within kettering area, the majority of crime committed on this ward is late night alcohol related, therefore by adding an additional outlet I believe that the crime level will increase.

3.The premises would be a problem to public saftey as the premises main entrance is located next to a very busy traffic junction, and i believe that people will stand outside the shop with cans and bottles drinking at diffrent times of the day, making it difficult for people to pass and enter of the main access routes into town, i have witnessed persons standing and drinking out other polish stores in kettering, and believe this will definatly happen here.

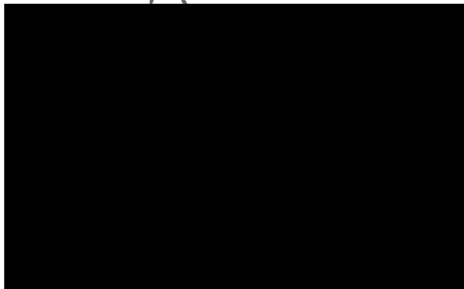

DEAR SIRS

I would like to object to the above application for the following reasons.

The prevention of crime and disorder:

I feel that by adding another licensed premises the William Knibb / All Saints wards will only bring more trouble to the town centre area, by recently attending the town centre forum the police indicated very clearly that crime was on the increase, at the majority of incidents were alcohol related.

Protection of children from harm:

35-41 MONTAGU ST IS A building that is divided up to many uses, including offices, a pine shop and a school/college, many if not all the students whom attend this school are well under the age of 18 yrs, therefore by adding a big alcohol outlet right next door to the school entrance will only be an invite, trying to encourage the student to try and purchase alcohol, and also advertising alcohol to the underage students.


Public safety

Again by looking at previous comments relating to the students at the street, I feel that people will congregate around the front and especially at the corner of Montagu St, Eskdail St junction, where the premises main entrance would be, making it very difficult for members of the public to pass by.
