1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

In accordance with the Council's Constitution this report seeks Councils approval to the changes required to the capital programme to take forward delivery of Housing Revenue account (HRA) new build at Scott Road.

2. **INFORMATION**

- 2.1 At its meeting in September, the Council's Executive Committee was presented with an update on the new build feasibility work on two sites Scott Road and Albert Street. A further report was presented at Executive Committee on 6th December.
- 2.2 The recommendations to Executive Committee at their December meeting were as follows:
 - a) Endorse the proposals for the procurement and financing of these schemes and approve the use of the Blueskies Framework to work with Westleigh on Scott Road.
 - Approve the appropriation of Scott Road from the General Fund to the HRA
 - c) Grant delegated authority to the Head of Housing in consultation with the Head of Resources and Head of Legal and Democratic to agree terms with Westleigh and progress the delivery of Scott Road
 - d) Note the proposals for taking Albert Street forward.
 - e) Recommend the changes required to the Capital Programme to this Council.
- 2.3 To comply with financial regulations and the Council's Constitution, any change to the capital programme greater than £250,000 needs to be recommended to full Council for approval. The financial implications in delivering Scott Road are summarised in the following table:
