***11.LC.67 TO CONSIDER A PRIVATE HIRE DRIVER'S LICENCE WHERE THE HOLDER IS ALLEGED TO HAVE ILLEGALLY PLYED FOR HIRE (C1)**

A report was submitted seeking the committee's decision in respect of a private hire driver's licence, where the holder is alleged to have illegally plied for hire.

Details of the application were provided and the applicant attended the meeting and gave further information and evidence relating to the alleged offence.

Sarah Clipstone, the Health Protection Officer attended the meeting and gave further information and evidence relating to the alleged offence.

PC James Condon attended the meeting and gave further information relating to the alleged offence

The committee considered all the facts in the report and came to the following conclusion:-

Having taken into account the evidence of PC Condon and Sarah Clipstone, the committee found the information given concerning the times of the private hire booking inconsistent, and was of the opinion that *the applicant* was plying for hire and therefore driving without insurance.

RESOLVED The decision of the Committee was that *the applicant's* private hire driver's licence was revoked on the grounds that he failed to comply with the requirements of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847, in that he plied for hire without having the necessary licence and also acted contrary to the certificate of motor insurance in effect on the vehicle at that time.

The applicant was notified of their right to appeal within 21 days.
